Nearly 20,000 homeless men, women and children have received assistance in returning to self-sufficiency, thanks to your support.

Let me share a story with you. I recently had the pleasure to hear from a young mother who became certified as a Nurse's Assistant while residing at the shelter. She loves her new career, and it has led her to realize her true passion — working with the elderly. She described her new life with pride, and noted that her confidence is helping her become a better parent. And then, bringing tears of pride to my eyes, she told me her plans to go back to school at UTA to become a registered nurse.

Each year brings new opportunities to help more people like this young mother regain self-sufficiency. To that end, we recently embarked on some exciting renovations, thanks to the Joe Barton Family Foundation and partners like you.

We know that in times of instability and change, providing a comfortable, safe environment is crucial. There's now a special area for the children to play while their parents check in, and when it's mealtime, residents eat family-style around a dinner table. We also just put in a library with additional computers for adults and teens to do homework without distraction.

Thanks to your partnership, which makes renovations like these possible, the Arlington Life Shelter has helped thousands of homeless parents and individuals secure and maintain employment. All but five of our shelter residents are currently working, providing income for their families and showing their children that, with effort, success is possible.

## You're Saving Lives

Not so long ago, John was a recent college graduate with a good job. But when the economy began to slip, John, who was self-employed, felt the pinch. It was virtually impossible for him to find work. After a while, he couldn't pay his bills — including rent.

John soon found himself without a home. For a while, he got by living with friends and occasionally sleeping in his car. But after a year of this lifestyle, his car broke down and he had exhausted all other resources.

Feeling as if he had nowhere else to turn, John slept on the streets, and occasionally in an abandoned house. This was not the life he had planned for himself as a boy, singing in the Texas Boys' Choir, or as a young man working hard in college...yet here he was, homeless and alone.

When it seemed John had lost everything, the [Arlington Life Shelter](#) was his beacon of hope,

providing him not only a warm bed and a hot meal, but also job programs and classes that will help him get his finances back in order.

"I have hope now. When you don't have any place to turn, and you feel like nothing's going to help..." John trails off. "I feel a lot better about the future now."

John is most excited about the Shelter's job program - he can't wait to be working again soon. John knows his transformation from homeless and jobless to a working, productive member of society won't be instant, but with his background and dedication, it's clear that he's certainly headed in the right direction.

"You help restore hope to people. You help restore dignity to people. You make people feel safe," John says with gratitude for your generosity to the Arlington Life Shelter. "You're actually saving lives."
